accommodation and complete much needed fencing work.

Justin Tarrant, Youlbury Centre Manager, said: "With such a large area to cover and so many activities on offer, it's so important that we get volunteers who come and make a real difference. We are thrilled with the Vodafone team who

have been fantastic and we are looking forward to them coming back in a few weeks."

charity that provides such brilliant activities. I wanted us to volunteer with The Scouts as it's a place we can continue to

go back to on a regular basis and really see the progress and difference we make."
